- Dissemination of Information to Public

Who should attend? - Livestock feeders, livestock producers and their employees, sale barn personnel, livestock feed suppliers, veterinarians, local law enforcement, public health officials, extension educators, emergency managers.

Federal Reserve Representatives Visit Central Nebraska

Nathan Kauffman and Erin Redemske from the Omaha Branch of the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City visited Central Nebraska in late June to learn more about the needs of the Central Nebraska region.

Nathan is an Assistant Vice President and Economist, and Erin is the Director of Public Affairs. During their discussion with CNEDD staff, Nathan and Erin learned that some of the top needs for the Central Nebraska region are: housing, jobs, broadband, community improvement, and of course, agriculture.

Nathan reported that the Federal Reserve is not just about the "fed rates" that you hear about on the news. And it is not just about serving the needs of urban communities - they know the

importance of rural Nebraska to the state and federal economy, and want to be a partner in playing a positive role for the entire State of Nebraska.

This meeting with Federal Reserve representatives came about due, in part, to CNEDD's invitation to Dell Gines, Federal Reserve Senior Community Development Advisor, as the keynote speaker at our Annual Conference which was held in May 2016. CNEDD will continue this relationship with the Federal Reserve to influence positive changes for the Central Nebraska region.
