



Flood Disaster Funding throughout the Region

It's been said that disaster recovery takes a long time, the work has been done, the projects have been completed, and now the CDBG-DR funds are being reimbursed to our counties and communities following the disastrous 2019 flooding. We helped 5 counties and 10 communities apply for federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Disaster Funds in June of 2022.

Nearly 1 million dollars are being reimbursed to those entities for repairs on infrastructure damaged during the devastating 2019 floods.
